

Understanding Barriers and Facilitators to Cultural Participation – Scoping Research

- Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) (esp. Art.30)
- Convention on Economic Social and Cultural Rights (CESCR) (esp. Art. 15)
- Country Reports, Committee documents, CRPD Shadow Reports
- **EU Countries (+UK)**



Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) EU Countries +UK



32 Country reports (initial reports for 26 countries and subsequent reports for 6 countries)

34 Lists of Issues (24 countries) 23 Concluding Observations (22 countries)

CRPD - Country Reports - EU Countries

+UK



- All Initial reports reviewed had some focus on culture.
- Variation in the amount of focus on arts/culture
- Range of ways that people with disabilities engage in culture (audience, participants, sometimes as artists)
- Often refer to sign language users (or Deaf Culture) under Article 21 (dealing with self-expression/access to information)

CRPD – Committee Reports - EU Countries + UK



Where an Article 30 recommendation is made in Concluding Observations –

Often to do with signing, ratifying or implementing the Marrakesh Treaty on copyright issues.

CRPD – Shadow Reports




Some engage with Article 30

Many disagreed with States' reports on accessibility of arts/culture and/or recognition of sign language.

A few positive about progress on culture in their countries, one: 'changes continuous and positive'

Convention on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (CESCR): EU Countries +UK


39 Country reports (25 countries; 3 had not filed reports since 2008)

32 Concluding Observations
(23 countries)

Convention on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (CESCR)

- Reports from many countries include reference to disability within their Article 15 responses
- Typically, address physical access, sometimes refer to free/discounted access, or to making libraries accessible to people with disabilities
- CESCR Committee documents often do not explicitly address disability within comments/recommendations
